

Out of those 6 residents expressed an interest in attending future meetings and helping where they can. Unfortunately, if we are unable to find more committee members and trustees there is a serious risk that the Community Centre will have to close at the end of next year.

1st Llanbradach Girls' Brigade

As many of you will know, Girls' Brigade has been in existence in Llanbradach for many years. Some of you may remember it as the Girls' Guildry which must have been formed in the early 1950s which later became known as the Girls' Brigade in the mid-1960s.

The company closed sometime in the late 1960's and later reopened in 1977.

We have seen many changes over the years, i.e. fashion, technology and especially attitude but one thing has remained the same throughout. I refer to the fact that we are a Christian organisation and the young people are welcome to join with us under such a We cover many framework. aspects of daily living, i.e. physical, educational, service and spiritual, but everything is run under the Christian ethos. people The young encouraged to respect themselves, those around them and their environment. certain conduct of behaviour is encouraged and expected from all those attending.

We are delighted to share some fantastic news with you. Three of our girls have achieved their **Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award** during the last 12 months. Teri-Louise Moorcraft received her Award at Buckingham Palace last May and Isabel Jones and Mollie Parfitt will be receiving theirs at Buckingham Palace in May of this year. Two of the girls have gone on to University and one is an Outdoor Activities Instructor. We very much miss them on a Friday evening but are thrilled with their success. Well done! Another of our group, Rhianedd Smith, is nearing the end of her Gold Award and we should see her receiving that special invite to the Palace soon. Rhianedd has also been with us for many years and is preparing for University this year. We will very much miss Rhianedd: she is such an encouragement to us and a great example to those in the Youth Group.

We have run the DofE Award Scheme over many years but

currently do not have anyone else participating in this, mainly due to the age range of those attending the Youth Group.

Our ages range from 41/2 upwards. The girls in the younger sections (those in **Primary and Junior School)** meet from 6.30 pm to 8 pm with the Youth Group (those in Comprehensive School) meeting from 8 pm to 9.30 pm. We meet on a Friday evening during term time at the Ebenezer Church Hall.
