Community Projects and Initiatives

1. Youth Sports Development

o We continue to support local youth sport by providing grants to Llanbradach AFC and by running the Summer Sport Scheme and Skateboarding sessions. As a result our young athletes are thriving!

In march and April 2024, we saw a hive of activity in the village whereby our partnership with TfW (Transport for Wales) and businesses undertook a big deep cleanse in the village and the installation of wooden planters.

4. Other projects

Llanbradach AFC Solar Panels Grant Application

We provided administration assistance to Llanbradach AFC in preparing a grants application for the provision and installation of solar panels. The goal was to enhance energy efficiency and sustainability.

Pwllypant Village Hall Solar Panels Grant Application


